

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

June 23, 2015

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, June 23, 2015, at 8:32 A.M. Mr. Williams was absent, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Finkel moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on June 16, 2015, and Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0 voice vote.

Mr. Finkel moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0 voice vote.

There was no old business.

Under new business, Mayor DeBaun said he had a request from Shelbyville Mainstreet. Brandy Coomes asked permission to close W. Washington St. from the Circle to the alley past First Federal Bank, on Saturday, July 11, from 8:00 A.M. until 12 Noon. This will be for the "Get Healthy Here" event. Then, on July 3, for the First Friday event, Brandy asked for the closing of E. Washington St., east of First Merchants Bank's drive-thru, to Pike St., starting at 4:00 P.M., to set up for the 5:00 P.M. tractors for the old-fashioned Fourth of July celebration. She also asked for the closing of the east side of the Circle, for overflow of the event, and leaving the west side of the Circle open for parking. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the requests for July 3 and July 11, and Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0 voice vote. Mr. Finkel wanted to congratulate everyone working so hard to make our downtown vibrant. He said it's certainly working, and last Friday's event is a testament to what the potential could be for our downtown.

City Engineer Matt House came forward asking the Board's permission to allow for a change order on work being done at the new Animal Shelter. Being the first of three exclusions that weren't in the original contract, Matt said Steve Dennis had given a quote of \$1,375.00 to install communication and internet lines at the Animal Shelter. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the request, and Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0 voice vote. The other change orders will be brought up in the near future.

Mayor DeBaun said Municipal Government Day would be held this Friday on the Public Square from 11:00 A.M. until 1:00 P.M. He said there would be a bicycle rodeo, and the Bicycle Shop and the Indiana Bicycle Coalition would be helping with safety demonstrations. The Mayor announced after the bike ride, a survey of bike routes would take place.

There being no further business, Mr. Finkel moved to adjourn.
