

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

January 31, 2017

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, January 31, 2017, at 8:30 A.M. All members were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting held on January 24, 2017, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Finkel moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

There was no old business.

Under new business, Mayor DeBaun said he had some SOG amendments from the Fire Department. Fire Chief Tony Logan talked about SOG 201, which is about the post incident exposure form, saying it's been added because cancer in the fire service is up. When live fire training conditions at the fire facility occurred, no records were documented, so now it's going to be documented as a run. On SOG 203, firefighters used to take their air packs off after a fire was contained, but not anymore. Chief Logan said it was proven for firefighter safety; they need to keep the air packs on completely through the operation, which would less likely cause cancer. Mr. Finkel made a motion to approve SOG's 201 and 203, with the following correction on SOG 201, on number III under responsibilities, number one, the word 'from' should be changed to the word 'form'. Mr. Williams seconded. When Chief Logan noticed there wasn't an amendment date on SOG 201, Mr. Finkel and Mr. Williams withdrew their motions. Mr. Finkel made a motion to approve SOG 201 and 203, making sure there is an amendment date on both, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Police Chief Mark Weidner had a letter of resignation, dated January 24, 2017, from probation Officer Todd Miller, which was one of two probation Officers hired last June. He said Officer Miller did complete the Indiana Law Enforcement Academy basic course, but he was severely struggling in the FTO program here. After being given a two week extension, he failed to make it past phase two and phase three, so he chose to resign. Mr. Williams moved to accept the resignation, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

There being no further business, Mr. Williams moved to adjourn.
