

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

August 1, 2011

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Common Council Chambers of City Hall on August 1, 2011, at 5:31 P.M. All Board members were present, and Mayor Furgeson presided.

Mr. Howard moved to approve the minutes of the regular meeting, July 26, 2011, and Mr. Barrick seconded. There was no public comment. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Barrick moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Howard seconded. There was no public comment. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

In old business, Plan Commissioner Tom DeBaun reported that Mr. Gary Purewell, the owner of the Cavalier's Resort and Hotel was ordered to appear at today's meeting, but informed him that he could not make it and sent his operations manager instead. Mr. DeBaun recommended that the Board order the Cavalier's Club representative to provide estimates for the work on the items that are outstanding, order those estimates to be approved and accepted by the building department, order the Cavalier's Club to submit to us a check in the amount equal to those estimates plus a contingency fee to be deposited into an escrow account, and issue an order for Mr. Purewell to appear so that he acknowledges and understands these terms. Mr. Howard moved to order the representative of the Cavalier's Club to provide estimates for the work on the items that are outstanding and have those estimates approved and accepted by the building department, and submit a check to the City from the Cavalier's Club in the amount equal to those estimates plus a contingency fee to be deposited into an escrow account and to order Mr. Gary Purewell to appear at a Board meeting, and Mr. Barrick seconded. There was no public comment. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

In new business, City Engineer Rodger Keller requested permission to advertise for bids for the reconstruction of East Michigan Road from Saraina Road to Progress Parkway. Mr. Keller stated that the bids will be due at 4:00 P.M. on August 22<sup>nd</sup>, with the bids being opened at the Board meeting on August 23<sup>rd</sup>. Mr. Barrick moved to allow for the advertisement of bids for the reconstruction of East Michigan Road, and Mr. Howard seconded. There was no public comment. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Also in new business, City Attorney Trent Meltzer presented a dog impoundment case for the Board's consideration. Mayor Furgeson noted that a dog owned by Amber Bergen bit a child that entered her yard and that the dog was chained at the time and a beware of dog sign was prominently posted in the yard. Mayor Furgeson also noted that the dog has not had the proper vaccinations. Mayor Furgeson asked if the dog will have to be vaccinated before it can be released. Animal Control Officer Deidra Schneider responded that the Board could make that a condition. Mr. Barrick moved to release the dog upon it getting the proper vaccinations, and Mr. Howard seconded. Ms. Bergen asked if she has to pay the \$25.00 fee since the dog was taken from her yard. Police Chief Bill Elliott stated that he felt that the fee should be waived since the \$25.00 fee is usually assessed to those owners that allow their dogs to run free. Mr. Howard removed his second, and Mr. Barrick removed his motion. Mr. Barrick moved to release the dog upon getting its vaccinations and waive the \$25.00 fee, and Mr. Howard seconded. There was no public comment. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

There being no further business, Mr. Howard moved to adjourn, and Mr. Barrick seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.
