

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

February 14, 2012

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Common Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, February 14, 2012 at 8:30 A.M. All board members were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Finkel moved to approve the minutes of the regular meeting February 6, 2012, and Mr. Williams seconded. There was no public comment. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Finkel moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Under old business, Deputy Plan Commission Director Michele Hansard talked about the house at 526 W. Hendricks St., where an issue to appear notice was ordered last week, in two weeks. Since then, she met last Thursday with Mike Major, a representative and hired contractor with Fannie Mae. After an inspection, he felt the house was still very sound, with just a few adjustments that need to be made. The biggest problem was mold, and he's asked Fannie Mae to get it removed, through contractors. Michele said she would contact Mike to appear at next week's Board meeting to discuss what's being done on the house.

Under new business, Michele talked about a nuisance problem on a house at 816 Elm St. She said they have trash and debris in their back yard, next to the alley. Although Enforcement Officer Troy Merrick has contacted Keith and Shawn Marie Williams several times about their trash, nothing has been done to clean the property, even after giving them 10 days notice. Michele asked the Board's permission to order Keith and Shawn Marie Williams to appear at next Tuesday's meeting. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the request, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Justin Willey asked the Board's permission to cut fallen trees behind the Animal Shelter's wooded area, for personal use, and at no cost to the City. It would only be for trees that have fallen, and he wouldn't cut any standing trees. Mayor DeBaun asked Justin to meet with City Attorney Trent Meltzer to sign papers that would release the City from any liability, and that only downed trees would be cut. Mr. Williams moved to approve the request, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

There being no further business, Mr. Finkel moved to adjourn, and Mr. Williams seconded. Motion carried on a 3-0 voice vote.
