

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

July 2, 2012

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Common Council Chambers of City Hall on Monday, July 2, 2012 at 5:28 P.M. Mr. Finkel was absent and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the minutes of the previous meetings, June 26 and 27, 2012, and Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0 voice vote.

Mr. Williams moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0 voice vote.

Under old business, Mayor DeBaun asked if anyone was present for either of the following addresses, 340 E. Pennsylvania St., or 106 Howard St. Since no one appeared, Mayor DeBaun said no action would be taken today, and moved to the next item of business.

Concerning the dog running loose complaint that was heard at last week's meeting, Mayor DeBaun has asked the Animal Control Officer to notify the owners of the dog to appear at next week's Board meeting so the issue can be discussed further.

Under new business, Mayor DeBaun said the City received one fuel bid for the remainder of this year, from Shelby County Co-Op. Mayor DeBaun opened the sealed bid and read the prices for each of the three octane gases: for 89 octane, \$2.7895; 87 octane, \$2.7228; 93 octane, \$2.928. The pumps would be open 24 hours per day, 7 days a week, unattended. For diesel fuel #2, the price would be \$2.9902, and diesel fuel blend, winter additive premium ulsd is \$3.0202, with a pricing date of June 28, 2012. Mayor DeBaun said this was for the Bonded location. Mr. Williams moved to take the bid under advisement for a week, and Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0 voice vote.

Parks Director Karen Martin talked about the community signs at Wal-Mart, where she's looking at putting in permanent signs, with the help of grant monies. She has bids in place, and has approval from Wal-Mart for permanent signs.. As has been done in the past, Karen asked permission to place temporary signs in the same locations to let the public know about an upcoming movie. Mr. Williams moved to approve placing temporary signs, and Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0 voice vote.

Mayor DeBaun read a document declaring that the City of Shelbyville is in a local disaster emergency for the next seven days because of the severe drought conditions. The emergency states that "no person shall cause, permit, or allow open burning on any property located within the City, and no person shall discharge or cause to be discharged any fireworks as defined in IC 22-11-14. No person shall discharge or cause to be discharged into the air or ground at any location within the City, any device, object or mechanism which is burning or has an open flame attached or included on any part of the device. This shall include cigarettes and other burning tobacco products." Any person who knowingly, intentionally, or recklessly violates the declaration commits a Class B misdemeanor.

There being no further business, Mr. Williams moved to adjourn, and Mayor DeBaun seconded. The motion was carried on a 2-0 voice vote.
