

BOARD OF PUBLIC WORKS AND SAFETY

Regular Meeting

June 12, 2012

The regular meeting of the Board of Public Works and Safety of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Common Council Chambers of City Hall on Tuesday, June 12, 2012 at 8:28 A.M. All members were present and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Mr. Finkel moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting, June 4, 2012, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Mr. Finkel moved to approve the claims as presented, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

There was no old business.

Under new business, Mayor DeBaun said there was a request from the Police and Fire Departments to approve their SOGs, and the Board has reviewed multiple drafts. Mr. Williams moved to approve the SOGs, and Mr. Finkel seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Dann Bird, Building and Plan Commission Director, said the Bells Ringing restaurant, at the corner of Jackson and S. Harrison St., requested permission for outdoor seating with tables and chairs in front of their restaurant. Dann said the owner wasn't able to attend this morning's meeting. Mr. Finkel moved to approve the request maintaining a 48 inch travel width on the sidewalk, and Mr. Williams seconded. The motion was carried on a 3-0 voice vote.

Amy Haacker, Shelbyville Mainstreet Director, said the "Summer on the Square" kickoff event will start this Saturday. She said it will include six art vendors on the northwest quadrant, there will be live music in front of Tour of Italy, the Optimist Club will have a bike giveaway and bike safety workshop in front of Sue Steele's Dance Studio on S. Harrison St., there will be health-oriented booths and workshops, and the Animal Shelter will be doing a pet adoption on E. Washington St. This will occur between noon and 4:00 P.M. The Garden Tour will be held between 10:00 A.M. and 2:00 P.M., and the people going on the tour can use their \$10.00 ticket as a \$10.00 coupon with any of the participating downtown businesses. On top of the Farmer's Market also going on Saturday, there will be a ribbon-cutting ceremony for the Bower Point Project that will be held at 4:00 P.M. Mayor DeBaun said this is a sanctioned event by the City, and it's not something where someone can set up anything they want on the sidewalk, whenever they want, on the Public Square.

There being no further business, Mr. Williams moved to adjourn.
