

## COMMON COUNCIL

Regular Meeting

July 15, 2013

The regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Common Council Chambers of City Hall on Monday, July 15, 2013, at 7:00 P.M. Councilman Brown opened with the Pledge of Allegiance, and Councilman Hamilton followed with a prayer. Councilman Asher was absent, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Councilman Hamilton moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting, July 1, 2013, and Councilman Nolley seconded. There was no public comment. The motion was carried on a 6-0 voice vote.

Under old business, on Resolution No. 2013-15, amending the tax abatement request for PK U.S.A., Inc., Councilman Brown moved to approve the request and Councilman Nolley seconded. Under discussion, attorney Peter DePrez talked about the brief changes that were made from two weeks ago, when he asked that this be heard tonight. Bill Kent, from PK, said Congressman Luke Messer will be visiting their Plant this coming Friday, and he said their local workforce, including temporary workers, is up to 500, of which 62% are from Shelby County. The motion was carried on a 6-0 voice vote.

On Ordinance No. 13-2718, re-establishing the CCD Fund rate at \$.05 cents, Councilman Nolley moved to approve the request, and Councilman Carmony seconded. Opening the floor for discussion, there was none from the Council, or the public. The motion was carried on a 5-1 voice vote, with Councilman Hamilton voting no.

On Ordinance No. 13-2720, amending the Capital Improvement Plan for 2013 EDIT expenditures, Councilman Nolley moved to approve this on second and final reading, and Councilman Brown seconded. Under discussion, no one from the Council or the public had any comment. The motion was carried on a 6-0 voice vote.

Under new business, on Ordinance No. 13-2721, amending Section 130.03 of the City Code of Ordinances, addressing Jake Brakes, Councilman Nolley moved to approve this on first reading, and Councilman Brown seconded. Under discussion, Mayor DeBaun said John Drew came to a Council meeting a few weeks ago to talk and complain about the loudness of the Jake Brakes being used by truck drivers on Colescott St., and it's been discussed off and on for the last few weeks. He said this adds Section 13, titled Braking Devices, allowing the Police Department to issue citations, rather than warnings. The motion was carried by a 6-0 voice vote on first reading. Councilman Phares was curious to know how loud 90 decibels (db) were because he's never heard trucks using the Jake Brakes. Councilman Brown did a quick Google search on a noise meter chart saying a jet taking off is 150 db, aircraft carrier decks were 140 db, a chain saw and oxygen torches were 120 db, and a garbage disposal is 80 db.

Under reports from Committees, Boards, and Commissions, City Attorney Trent Meltzer said the Shelbyville Redevelopment Commission signed off on a report tonight, and had it passed out to the Councilmen, Mayor, and Clerk-Treasurer. He said this report was newly mandated this year by the State, concerning the revenue from each of the TIF Districts, as well as each parcel included in each TIF District. Noting that some of the information was missing on the parcel list, he said he's still waiting on some information from the County Auditor. If he gets that information prior to the Council having to turn this report into the State, he'll go back to the Redevelopment Commission to amend their report and update it. He said this report was to be given to the Council, and then a report will have to be sent to the State through the Gateway system by October 1. Several Councilmen and the Mayor thanked Mr. Meltzer for a good job.

Mayor DeBaun said the next Council meeting would be held on Monday, August 5, at 8:30 A.M., with the prelim meeting starting at 8:00 A.M. This is being done to accommodate a schedule conflict.

There being no further business, Councilman Nolley moved to adjourn.
