

COMMON COUNCIL

Regular Meeting

April 7, 2014

The regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Common Council Chambers of City Hall on Monday, April 7, 2014, at 7:01 P.M. Councilman Hamilton opened with the Pledge of Allegiance, and Councilman Brown followed with a prayer. All Councilmen were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Councilman Hamilton moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting, March 17, 2014, and Councilman Fero seconded. There was no public comment. The motion was carried on a 7-0 voice vote.

Under miscellaneous business, Councilman Nolley moved to accept the City Financial Reports, and Councilman Hamilton seconded. There being no discussion, the motion was carried on a 7-0 voice vote.

Mayor DeBaun read a Proclamation declaring April as "The Month of the Military Child".

There was no old business.

Under new business, on Resolution No. 2014-11, a special appropriation of \$100,000.00 was requested for the Blue River Trail Grant for 2014. Councilman Nolley moved to approve the request, and Councilman Brown seconded. The motion was carried on a 7-0 voice vote.

Mayor DeBaun announced that Resolution No. 2014-12 would not be heard tonight, and he advised the petitioner of that.

On Ordinance No. 14-2735, a request has been made to annex 2806 E. Range Rd. with a zoning classification of BH, Business Highway. This is for the Bavarian Haus, or Half Pints Bistro. Councilman Brown moved to approve the request on first reading, and Councilman Nolley seconded. Mayor DeBaun said in the prelim meeting that this was a voluntary request for annexation by the owner, and Kathy DeMoss was present to answer any questions. She said this was something the family had intended to do for a long time, but with the passing of her Dad and other illnesses in the family, they just haven't been able to do it. There being no further comments or questions, the motion was carried on a 7-0 voice vote. Mayor DeBaun said this will now be remanded to the Plan Commission for a public hearing.

On a final note, Mayor DeBaun wanted to recognize and thank the local veterans who attended the Honor Flight Saturday. They were flown to Washington, D.C., for free, to visit the World War II Memorial and other sites. Those attending were Dwain Laird, Bill Shaw, Paul Holzhausen, and Betty Raymer. Once again, he wanted to recognize and thank them for their service to our Country. WWTP Supt. Brad Fix said he and many others went to the Indianapolis International Airport Saturday evening to welcome back the veterans by waving flags, and showing their gratitude and support by cheering for what they did. Mayor DeBaun said he was asked to write a letter to each of the individuals, so he did research on them all, and said what they did in service to country was quite fascinating, then returning home to raise families.

There being no further business, Councilman Nolley moved to adjourn.
