

## COMMON COUNCIL

Regular Meeting

February 3, 2014

The regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Shelbyville, Indiana, was held in the Common Council Chambers of City Hall on Monday, February 3, 2014, at 7:02 P.M. Police Chief England's daughter, Libby, opened with the Pledge of Allegiance, and Councilman Hamilton followed with a prayer. All Councilmen were present, and Mayor DeBaun presided.

Councilman Nolley moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting, January 22, 2014, and Councilman Brown seconded. There was no public comment. The motion was carried on a 5-0-2 voice vote, with Councilmen Carmony and Phares abstaining.

Under miscellaneous business, Councilman Nolley moved to approve the City Financial Reports, and Councilman Asher seconded. There being no discussion, the motion was carried on a 7-0 voice vote.

Under old business, on Ordinance No 14-2732, adopting the 2013 S-10 Supplement to the Code of Ordinances, Councilman Brown moved to approve this on second and final reading, and Councilman Nolley seconded. There being no discussion, the motion was carried on a 7-0 voice vote.

On Ordinance No. 14-2733, adding subpart (E) to Section 50.055 of the City Code of Ordinances, Councilman Nolley moved to approve this on second and final reading, and Councilman Hamilton seconded. There being no discussion, the motion was carried on a 7-0 voice vote.

Under new business, on Resolution No. 2014-5, opposing the elimination of business personal property tax, Mayor DeBaun said this was discussed in the prelim meeting, and is something that he is very passionate about, but there were possibly a couple Council members who still have some questions, so he asked that this be moved to the next Council meeting. Councilman Fero moved that this be postponed until the February 17 Council meeting, and Councilman Carmony seconded. The motion was carried on a 7-0 voice vote.

Concerning the six Uniform Conflict of Interest Disclosure Statements that were filed, Councilman Fero moved that they be approved, and Councilman Carmony seconded. The motion was carried on a 5-0-2 voice vote, with Councilmen Nolley and Brown abstaining because they were two of the six filing Disclosure Statements.

There being no further business, Councilman Hamilton moved to adjourn, and Councilman Brown seconded.
