

COUNTY OF RESIDENCY AT TIME OF HOMELESSNESS



Nearly half of local homeless residents came to be homeless directly from renting a home or apartment. About a quarter couch-surfed first and then became homeless. Only about 10% incarceration as their immediately-preceding housing.


